

Imports Delivery Area Officers

- Engage and build relationships with all ports and airports in England.
- Work collaboratively with PHAs and LAs by offering reassurance, assistance and guidance on their processes and activities.
- Gather information on the type of food and feed imports that are entering the ports.
- Become a single point of contact for the PHAs/LAs in their assigned ports and assist with queries.
- Support ports and airports with pre-empting and delivering changes in legislation.
- Communicate effectively and gather useful feedback and information for the wider Imports and Exports team.





Training

 The FSA has been working to produce a suite of imported food training for LAs/PHAs

- In 2019, we have released:
 - 2 x online courses
 - 2 x face to face courses



Introduction to Imported Food & Official Controls

- Free e-learning launched March 2019
- Mainly aimed at inland officers and newer PHOs



How official controls are carried out		
Official controls are carried out by the Official Fish Inspector, Port Health Officer, Official Veterinarian or other suitably trained officer, according to the nature and origin of the product.	Common types of a	nalysis/testing
The primary, systematic checks carried out take the form of documentary , identity and physical checks . Which of these apply, and to what extent, is prescribed by legislation. If the checks are satisfactory then the goods will be certified for free circulation, following required signatures and stamps on the CVED/CED.		漢漢
For POAO the products requiring veterinary checks are listed in Commission Decision 2007/275/EC along with composite products and foods which are exempt. Physical check frequencies are specified in Commission Decision 94/360/EC.		
For High-Risk FNAO they are as specified in the specific import legislation for that product according to its origin.

- 2-day classroom-style course

OCR – Regulation (EU) 2019/1081 14th December

COMMISSION DELEGATED REGULATION (EU) 2019/1081

of 8 March 2019

establishing rules on specific training requirements for staff for performing certain physical checks at border control posts



Reg (EU) 2019/1081

Article 1

Subject matter and scope

- This Regulation lays down rules establishing specific training requirements for the following staff as referred to in Article 49(2)(a) and (b) of Regulation (EU) 2017/625, performing physical checks at border control posts:
- (a) staff assisting an official veterinarian in performing physical checks on animals, except aquatic animals, or on meat and edible meat offal;
- (b) staff performing physical checks on aquatic animals, on products of animal origin other than the ones referred to in point (a), on germinal products or on animal by-products.
- This Regulation shall not apply to official veterinarians and to official plant health officers.
- Article 2 General obligations on CAs concerning training
- Article 3 Requirements concerning the subject matter of the training

on official controls and other official activities performed to ensure the application of food and feed law, rules on animal health and welfare, plant health and plant protection products, amending Regulations (EC) No 999/2001, (EC) No 396/2005, (EC) No 1069/2009, (EC) No 1107/2009, (EU) No 1151/2012, (EU) No 652/2014, (EU) 2016/429 and (EU) 2016/2031 of the European Parliament and of the Council, Council Regulations (EC) No 1/2005 and (EC) No 1099/2009 and Council Directives 98/58/EC, 1999/74/EC, 2007/43/EC, 2008/119/EC and 2008/120/EC, and repealing Regulations (EC) No 854/2004 and (EC) No 882/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council, Council Directives 89/608/EEC, 89/662/EEC, 90/425/EEC, 91/496/EEC, 96/23/EC, 96/93/EC and 97/78/EC and Council Decision 92/438/EEC (Official Controls Regulation)

Common Health Entry Documents (CHEDs)

- The Common Veterinary Entry Document (CVED) is currently contained in Annex III to Regulation 136/2004 but will be repealed
- The CVED will be replaced by a Common Health Entry Document or 'CHED'. CHED P will be required for POAO.
- All CHEDs are contained in Annex II to the 'IMSOC Regulation'.



Common Health Entry Documents (CHEDs)

- Three distinct parts now rather than being squeezed on to a double sided sheet
- Very similar to the CVED some new requirements and some familiar sections have been moved about
- Detailed guidance now issued at the start of the Annex but it is a consolidated version for all CHEDs.
