CHANGES TO PERMITTED TREATMENTS FOR IMPORTS OF TREATED FEATHERS INTO THE UK

Purpose

1. To inform BIPs of changes to permitted treatments for the import of treated feathers into the UK.

Background

- 2. As stated in Annex XIV, Chapter II, Section 6(b) of <u>Regulation (EU) No 142/2011</u>, treated feathers, parts of feathers and down can be imported provided the following requirements are met:
 - Are accompanied by a commercial document stating that the feathers and parts of feathers or down have been treated with a steam current or by another method that ensures that no unacceptable risks remain and are securely enclosed in packaging and dry; and
 - Unless the commercial document states that they have been factory washed and treated with hot steam at 100°C for at least 30 minutes, they are sent to a registered establishment or plant for such treatment.
- 4. To assist importers who do not treat their feathers with a steam current, there is now a list of additional treatment methods which will be acceptable. The additional treatment methods are:
 - Machine washing with a detergent or another method to remove organic material from the feathers followed by one or more of the following treatments:
 - i. A heat treatment of at least 48 degrees Celsius for a minimum of 2 weeks;
 - ii. Irradiation with at least 20 kGy;









- iii. Fifty-three ml of 40 % formaldehyde per cubic metre for at least 8 hours at 22-24 °C:
- iv. Fifty-three ml of 40% formaldehyde and 35 grams of potassium permanganate per cubic metre for 8 hours at 22 24 °C Soaked in 10% formalin for 4 4.5 hours;
- v. Hydrochloric acid solution for 1 hour at 52 °C;
- vi. Methyl-bromide: 24 to 32 g/m³ for 24 hours;
- vii. Hydrogen peroxide for 3 hours;
- viii. Heat treatment of 74°C for at least 30 minutes.
- 5. A commercial document must accompany the consignment stating the treatment method used. Unless the commercial document states that the feathers have been factory washed and treated with hot steam at 100°C for at least 30 minutes or treated by another method described in point 4 above, the consignment must be sent directly to a registered establishment or plant for hot steam treatment or a treatment by another method as stated in point 4 above.
- 6. The new treatment methods will therefore come into force on 1st July 2018.
- 7. To enable importers to comply with the new treatment methods a transitional period of 3 months will be in place until 1st October 2018 to allow time for any changes to be met.
- 8. An amended import information note ABP IIN 22 will be made available shortly.

Action for OVSs

- 9. To be aware of the new treatment conditions as stated in point 4 above.
- 10. To be aware of the transitional period and that the requirement for new treatment conditions will come into force on 1st July 2018.
- 11. To inform importers of the changes and transitional period.
