TEMPORARY CONTINGENCY MEASURES RELATED TO OFFICIAL CONTROLS WHICH CAN BE DRAWN ON AT BORDER CONTROL POSTS (BCPs) DURING THE COVID-19 OUTBREAK

Purpose

To inform you that the temporary contingency measure to allow non-Official Veterinarians (non-OVs) to carry out physical and ID checks on some third country imports has been reinstated. BCPs should report to Defra / FSA before applying the easement. The easement applies until further notice.

The other two temporary easements – accepting electronic documents for some third country imports and remote documentary checks – remain in place until further notice and may be drawn on.

Background

Last year, a number of temporary easements were introduced to accommodate for disruptions to the UK's official control system resulting from the Covid-19 outbreak. The legal powers to introduce these easements were previously provided for in Commission Implementing Regulation 2020/466 (as amended), which expired on 1 February 2021.

On 31 January 2021, <u>The Official Controls (Temporary Measures) (Coronavirus)</u> (<u>Amendment) Regulations 2021</u> entered into force, providing a legal basis to continue with and re-introduce some of the easements that were introduced as a result of the Covid-19 outbreak.
