# Important Announcement: Extension of the grace period for movements of veterinary medicines between Great Britain and Northern Ireland

Date issued: 19 December 2022

### **Purpose**

To inform that the European Commission has extended the grace period for movements of veterinary medicines until 31 December 2025

## **Background**

Today the European Commission issued the following <u>announcement</u> which provides for a three-year extension to the grace period for veterinary medicines until 31/12/2025.

These arrangements will mean that the current processes for moving veterinary medicines between Great Britain and Northern Ireland will continue to be administered as they have been up to this point.

We welcome this extension to the veterinary medicine grace period from the Commission and are looking forward to further discussions on veterinary medicines in the New Year. We will continue to work for a long-term, sustainable solution to the supply of veterinary medicines.

The Veterinary Medicines Directorate's <u>Information Hub</u> guidance pages will reflect the arrangement to extend the grace period for veterinary medicines.
